*The Tramway Museum is still a hive of construction activity, but the first phase, with a total of five buildings and associated pavements and asphalted roads, is now nearing completion. The shopfronts concept has been a success, the museum has opened a large new bus exhibition hall, and we have been able to record a gratifying 15 percent rise in visitor numbers. Everything bodes well for the future, while the maintenance and restoration of trams and buses continues at the various workplaces – this year, the department in Bornholm was able to deliver motor vehicle KS 567 and trailer KS 226, beautifully restored to their 1911 appearance.*
